




Useful information for living on Cheung Chau.

Emergency Casualty Evacuation (ECE). In a real emergency such as premature child-birth, serious accident etc., call 3-665827 and ask for the 'duty controller' who will organise a helicopter (if he judges the case to be a justified emergency).

Noise at night, (1100 - 0700hrs). Telephone Cheung Chau Police Station (0251) and ask for the duty officer (sgt). Be prepared to go with the patrol PC's and show them where the noise is coming from. In other words don't just complain and go back to sleep. If you want to prosecute the offenders (and therefore discourage other potential offenders) you have to be at the scene with the police. Offenders liable to prosecution (persecution?) are construction sites after 1900hrs or on Sundays and public holidays - unless a permit has been issued. Also rowdy barbecues etc.

Fire Station. Tel no: 0254. If you spot a fire which can't be put out by an extinguisher, sand, blankets etc. you may have to resort to the fire engine. Do whatever you can to put the fire out while waiting (and waiting ...) for the engine to arrive.

Animals. If you or your animal needs putting down or any other kind of veterinary service, take it to the C.A.S. (Civil Aid Service) which is located near the police station, on the hill going down towards the post office. The vet is there once a week (Tuesdays, after 10.00am).

Ferry Service. Turn up in good time to avoid delays due to crowds, hawkers or your own inebriation. Arrangements can be made to be picked up on Green Island on foggy days.

Dirt, smells etc. Do call U.S.D. (5-452437) to complain about blocked drains, obstructions, bad road surfaces and litter problems. The 'litter hot-line' telephone number is 5-95555.

Bonanza Suen is your man for putting up shelves, building cupboards, painting ceilings and floors (at the same time) and any other odd jobs. He also enjoys a good natter over a cup of tea. Also try Chan Sui Fai - he's used to working in Hong Kong and doesn't speak very much English, but don't worry, call him at 8522 and ask for Helen - who does speak English! For putting up TV aerials, fixing Hi-Fi's, TV's and any other general electrical work call Mr Au (8308). His shop is past the market on the right hand side (opposite a cake shop). There's also Victor Lee who does the same kind of work. His number is 1158.

The plumber is Chu Lam who is near the Golden Dragon cinema (2203). Tat Chuen seems to be the most popular place for gas. Their number is 0570 and they will deliver your gas within a few days of ordering. If no-one answers the phone and there's no-one at the store (which is very often the case), just leave a note for them. The store is on the left, up the first lane after turning right off the ferry. You can get newspapers reserved for you at most stalls but the lady at the bottom of Peak Rd. will actually deliver it to your flat for a small service fee (well worth paying). By the way Bonanza's phone number is 8242.

eating salty fish and shrimp paste for his tea.


Then the British — nasty lot!

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
